

Linguistic school created by billionaire as an attempt to stop the extinction of Native Languages

Bemauch-Tlamatini the first free native language school in Mexico

Mexico City, Mexico- The Mexican billionaire, Alan Santiago, inaugurated the past Sunday, the first free-of-charge native linguistic school in Mexico, named Bemauch-Tlamatini Nemachtiloyan. The school's purpose is to stop the extinction of Native languages in the republic.

Bemauch-Tlamatini encourages Mexican diversity through the spread of linguistics. The school is aware of the numerous variations that languages like Nahuatl, Zapoteco and Tolteca have in different republic regions. That is why the school hires people from those specific regions of the country to teach their language.

The school will teach indigenous languages to Spanish speakers while creating jobs for indigenous people. The indigenous people who wish to teach their language will receive accommodation like Spanish lessons (if they do not speak the language), a place to live, and monthly salaries.

"I spent too much time watching the government do nothing while native languages in Mexico went extinct," said Alan Santiago. "That is why I decided to create Bemauch-Tlamatini, to preserve and protect the indigenous languages by teaching them to Mexicans around the republic."

The billionaire is not the first to show interest in protecting and preserving native languages in Mexico. In the past, the Mexican government had already taken action to stop the extinction of native languages without success, causing schools to shut down two years after their inauguration.

"Learning that the government failed to protect and preserving Mexican diversity. I took it upon myself to find a way to preserve indigenous culture and communities while providing jobs for them," stated the Founder of Bemauch-Tlamatini.

The school encourages Mexican citizens from Guerrero to start learning Tlapaneco since it is one of the languages with fewer speakers. Suppose the school perceives a large interest in learning the language. In that case, they will provide the necessary equipment to the professors and students who might not have the necessary tools to start their online learning.

Similarly, due to the pandemic, the school will accommodate professors and students, providing them with the necessary equipment to start lessons as soon as possible. The school will keep

updated on the Pandemic situation in Mexico City and hopes to expand to other states outside of Mexico City at the beginning of 2022.
